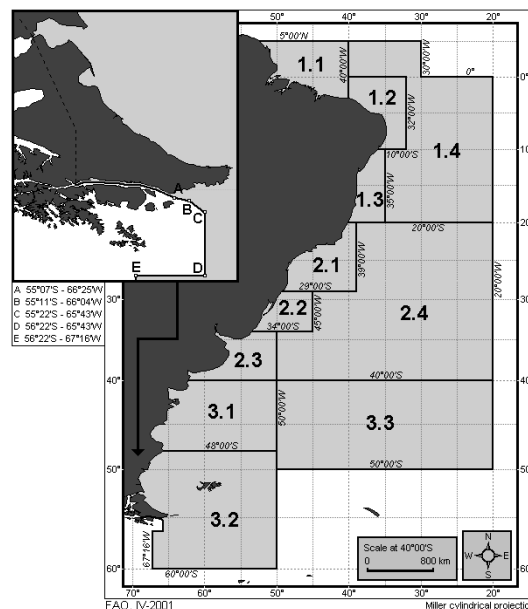
Bringing fisheries sustainability into the High Seas The case of the Atlantic South West (FAO41)
